Finding Scholarly/peer-reviewed Journals

Begin by accessing the Klinck Memorial Library website:

In the left-hand column, click on the link **EBSCO Gateway**.

Databases of particular interest in education are the **Academic Search Premier, ERIC, Professional Development Collection, SocINDEX and Teacher Reference Center**.

Academic Search Complete

Academic Search Complete is the world's most valuable and comprehensive scholarly, multi-disciplinary full-text database, with more than 8,500 full-text periodicals, including more than 7,300 peer-reviewed journals. In addition to full text, this database offers indexing and abstracts for more than 12,500 journals and a total of more than 13,200 publications including monographs, reports, conference proceedings, etc. The database features PDF content going back as far as 1887, with the majority of full text titles in native (searchable) PDF format. Searchable cited references are provided for more than 1,400 journals.

AgeLine focuses exclusively on the population aged 50+ and issues of aging. *AgeLine* is the premier source for the literature of social gerontology and includes aging-related content from the health sciences, psychology, sociology, social work, economics, and public policy. *AgeLine* indexes over 200 journals, books, book chapters, and reports. Publication coverage is from 1978 to the present, with selected coverage from 1966-1977

Now with the EBSCO search interface in the browser, let's conduct a basic search by typing in the term: **educational leadership**. Set the Search Mode to **Find all my search terms** to combine both terms and narrow the results. Set the limiters to search and retrieve full-text, peer-reviewed articles by checking the **Full Text** and **Scholarly/Peer Reviewed Journals** boxes. Click **Search** when you are finished setting your search limiters.

In the Search Results, each record will include a brief citation, a list of subjects, and a link to the full text article. Place the cursor over the **Article Preview** icon to view the abstract. Click the link for **HTML Full Text** or **PDF Full Text** to open an article.

number will begin with either **EJ** (for ERIC journal) or **ED** (for ERIC document).



Other databases will assign a **DOI** (digital object identifier) or **Accession Number**.

Finding Dissertations and Theses
