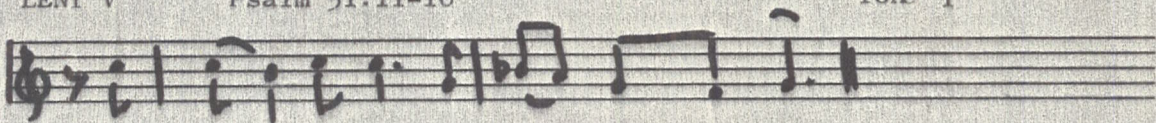
¹ The LORD is my light and my salvation;

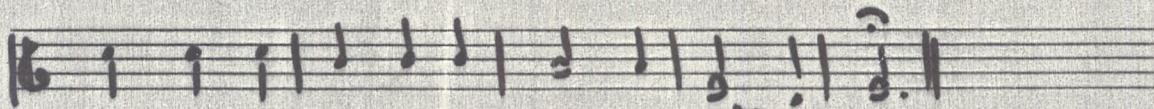

(v. 1)

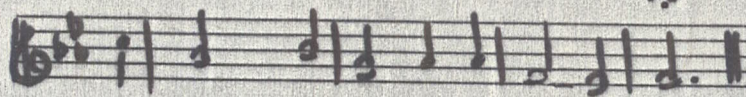

Be pleased, O God, to de-liv-er me.

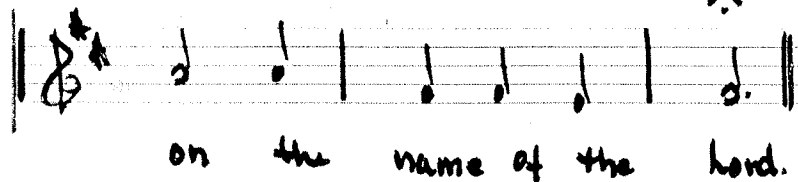

- ¹²Many young bulls encircle me;*
strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- ¹³They open wide their jaws at me,*

- ¹⁴I am poured out like water;
all my bones are out of joint;*
my heart within my breast
is melting wax.
- ¹⁵My mouth is dried out like a potsherd;
my tongue sticks
to the roof of my mouth;*
and you have laid me
in the dust of the grave.
- ¹⁶Packs of dogs close me in,
and gangs of evildoers circle around me;*
they pierce my hands and my feet.
I can count all my bones.
- ¹⁷They stare and gloat over me;*
they divide my garments among them;
they cast lots for my clothing.
- ¹⁸Be not far away, O LORD;*
you are my strength;
hasten to help me.
- ¹⁹Save me from the sword,*
my life from the power of the dog.
- ²⁰Save me from the lion's mouth,*
my wretched body
from the horns of wild bulls.
- ²¹I will declare your name to my brethren,*
in the midst of the congregation
I will praise you.
- ²²Praise the LORD, you that fear him;*
stand in awe of him,
O offspring of Israel;
